Riedizioni has a collection of products made from an innovative material which combines waste from the textile industry – scraps such as kimono silk or jute sacking – with plastic. This innovative process developed by Luisa Cevese is a contradictory combination of craft and industry and ensures each piece is different but equally desirable.

As Head of Research for renowned Italian textile company Mantero, Luisa became aware of the amount and consistency of textile waste. This led her to consider the possibility of a design project using scraps as a basic element. The result is a range of products (from bags and baby bibs to raincoats and rugs) that are fun yet elegant, modern and classic – opposites that definitely attract.
